
## **Message from the Personal Representative**


## Message from the Secretary

## **Herndon Clinic at FHSU**




Sweet and soft-spoken five-year old Chance has been receiving speech and language services since he was 17 months old. Chance's mother first heard about the Herndon Clinic from her pediatrician and Early Childhood Development Services. She had him evaluated at the Herndon Clinic in the fall of 2014, and a few months later, he began receiving individual speech-language services at the clinic. He continued services at the Herndon Clinic for the following two academic years until he started preschool and was served by the school district speech-language pathologist (SLP). In March 2018, Chance's mother returned to the Herndon Clinic due to his success there in previous semesters. Although he made progress with the school SLP, his mother wanted to provide Chance every opportunity available for improved communication.

Early on, Chance's clinicians aimed to increase his expressive language skills. He was not talking much so the goal was to increase the number of words he used and his utterance length. Once he was talking more, the focus in therapy shifted to speech sounds and improving his intelligibility. An early speech target was improving his ability to produce /s/ blends. Chance's mother stated that his progress was "outstanding" and "amazing to see."

After further evaluation of Chance's growing and changing speech and language skills this semester, his current clinician, Madison, identified persisting phonological processes in Chance's speech like cluster reduction (e.g. dropping /s/ in "stop" sounding like "top"). She has implemented a new treatment approach that applies principles of motor

learning in order to achieve a high number of repetitions of words and sounds per session. Madison works with him for 30 minutes, twice a week, in hopes to strengthen those areas of weakness and improve Chance's speech and language, so that he can flourish academically and socially.

Chance's mother made the statement that the Herndon Clinic and each of Chance's clinicians have been "amazing." When asked what she values most about the services, she stated that she values "how personal they are" and the fact that she has the opportunity to talk closely with the supervisor about Chance's progress and her concerns." Chance's mother advised other parents, "If you have the slightest bit of concern about your child's speech, do not hesitate to reach out for assistance. You will never regret it. If anything you are setting your child up for success in school and helping them out on all aspects of their future schooling." She credits the Scottish Rite Foundation for making it "possible to continue speech services for Chance" and for their "willingness to help and serve those who are in need."
